As the number of Covid-19 cases rise locally, we are starting to see some cases in local schools and households in Holt. We still have not had a positive case at school, but is worth recapping the symptoms and procedure so everyone can remain vigilant.

We ask parents not to send children to school if they show any of the symptoms of coronavirus (a high temperature, a new continuous cough, a loss or change to their smell or taste <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/>). We also ask parents to inform the school immediately if a child or a family member shows signs of any of these symptoms or has booked a test. Members of a household should isolate if they have a suspected case, but the school does not need to take any further action. If a child receives a positive test result, the children in the same class (bubble) will be asked to self isolate for 14 days. Other members of these households will not be required to self isolate unless their child develops symptoms. All other children at the school will be able to continue to attend as normal unless the school is advised otherwise.

If a child receives a negative result they can return to school as long as they are well enough to do so. If a parent or sibling tests positive then the whole household will need to isolate, but the school will not need to take any further action.
