### Topics



**Rivers:** In this geography unit we will be learning about how rivers are formed and their role in the environment. We will also learn about the impact that people have on river environments.

**Electricity and Light:** This science topic will see the class building and investigating circuits and will teach about how light travels in straight lines and creates shadows. We will also find out about the role of light in how the eye works..

### English

We will start the term using the book 'The day the crayons quit' to inspire some in-character letter writing. We will also study the poetry of Grace Nichols and use her work to inform our own poem writing.

After half term we will be looking at the narrative poem 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes and then we begin a theme-park project which will involve writing for a range of purposes such as leaflets and reports.



### Maths

This term's maths lessons will focus on building arithmetic skills at place value, the 4 operations and fractions. We will also be looking at coordinates and translating shapes.

### PE
