Welcome back to school everyone and we hope you all had a lovely Summer.

Attendance

The beginning of the school year is a good time to remind everyone of the importance of good attendance at school. Research shows that children with poor attendance are less likely to achieve well at school, which can have a damaging effect on their life chances. Our attendance rate remains well below the national average and it is a priority for the school to improve the attendance rate this year.

I have put all the dates for holidays this year on the calendar so please do not organise any holidays in term time. We are not allowed to authorise any holidays and the Local Authority have resumed issuing fixed penalty notices for unauthorised absences. Please see the attendance letter on the website for more details.

If a child is ill then please contact the office in the morning so that it can be marked on the register. We will text you if we have not been given a reason for an absence. If we do not receive a reply we will mark the absence as unauthorised.

Please note that children should arrive at school between 8.45am and 9.00am. The registers close at 9.05 and anyone arriving after that will be marked as late. We will send an attendance report home at the end of each term and invite parents to a meeting if their child is deemed persistently absent.

<u>P.E Kit</u>

It was lovely to see everyone return to school wearing the correct school uniform. We have made some changes this year. Junior children (Y3-Y6) need to come to school in uniform everyday. On the days that they have PE they will change at school. This will allow us more flexibility when we have P.E and help the children prepare for when they move to High School. Boys and girls will get changed in separate classrooms. They should bring their PE kit in a separate bag which can remain at school during the week. Infant children (YR-Y2) will continue to come to school in their PE kit, on the days that they have a PE lesson. The school PE kit is: navy or black shorts; white t-shirt; sports shoes. Children with long hair need a fabric hair-tie. In the winter your child may wear a black or navy tracksuit top and/or bottoms over their PE kit.
